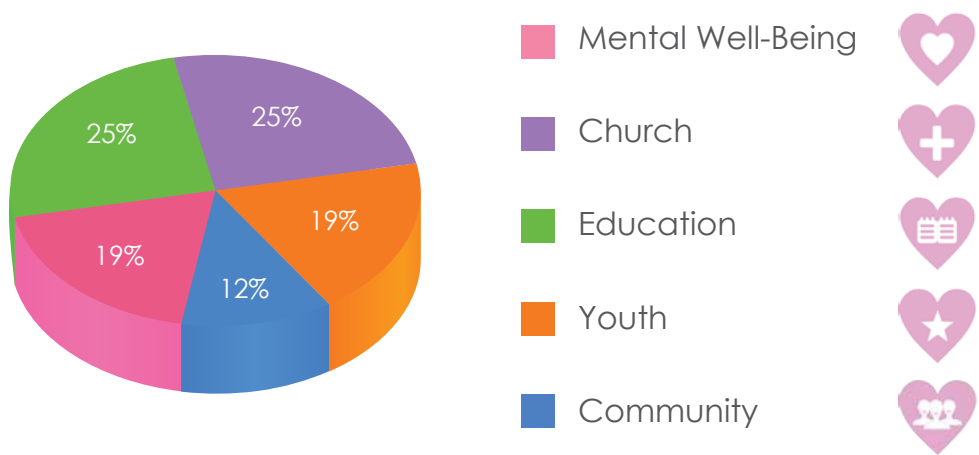

Partner: St. James' Settlement
Commencement Date: 1 April, 2014
Duration: 1 year
Beneficiaries: Women discharged from IMHP



Run by St. James' Settlement, S.P.A. Project is a depression-relapse prevention programme for women who have completed the Integrated Mental Health Programme (IMHP). Through therapeutic activities, support groups and individual counselling, participants can learn new skills and build inner strength (Strength Based Perspective), build up a social network (Peer Support) and build hope for new life (Affirmation to Recover). This project will help participants make healthy life choices and move forward on the road to recovery.

New Project Highlights

Dance with Depression Member Therapy Sponsorship Programme

Partner: Dance with Depression Association
Commencement Date: 1 November, 2013
Duration: 1 year
Beneficiaries: Patients suffering from depression



Dance with Depression Association (DWD) has been established as a charitable organization in Hong Kong since 2012 and was formed by a group of volunteer social workers, counsellors, psychologists and doctors. They provide emotional support groups and individual counselling for depressed patients.

Because of the high relapse rate of patients with chronic depression, CPF sponsored DWD in 2013 to help low-income patients by providing financial assistance for individual counselling or psychotherapy.

Two lectures were held, on 7 and 9 March, 2014, at All Saints' Cathedral and St John's Cathedral. Over 160 participants attended the talks, learning how religious diversity and interaction between people of different faiths can foster a culture of mutual respect.

New Project Highlights

Heep Yunn School Fundraising Campaign

Beneficiaries: Students at Heep Yunn School who require financial aid



Heep Yunn School was opened in 1936. The School was converted from a government-funded school into a Direct Subsidy Scheme School in 2012.

The school believes no qualified student should be deprived of a quality education because of financial reasons. In order to fund scholarships for students in need, the Fundraising Sub-committee was set up to advise the Council on fundraising projects.

CPF made a donation to the school's fundraising campaign, which provides funds to subsidize the cost of tuition and fees for school activities, enabling students-in-need to fully participate in school life. Support from organizations like CPF gives Heep Yunn School more financial flexibility, allowing them to launch new programmes that provide a well-rounded learning experience for students, recruit and retain top-quality teachers who are committed and caring, and invest in new facilities that meet the needs of current and future students.

Collaborating with FoFo by el Willy (a recipient of the Bib Gourmand Recognition Award in the Hong Kong and Macau Michelin Guide 2013), CPF organized a Spanish Fiesta for students in SKH St. Mary's Church Mok Hing Yiu College and Heep Yunn School on 26 and 27 June 2014. Teachers and students were first given an introduction on Spanish culture and were taught simple words and phrases. They then had fun cooking a few Spanish dishes under the guidance of the chefs. Teachers, principals and CPF representatives savoured the freshly-made dishes, as well as the dishes that CPF ordered from FoFo.



New Project Highlights

Foodlink Food Delivery

Partner: Foodlink Foundation
Commencement Date: 1 November, 2013
Duration: 1 year
Beneficiaries: People in need



Established in 2001, Foodlink taps into Hong Kong's ample resources in an effort to mitigate hunger in the city by arranging regular deliveries of safe-to-eat surplus food from various food outlets to those in need – including homeless people living in shelters and on the street, the elderly, the unemployed and other disenfranchised individuals and families.

Since November 2013, CPF has been supporting the operational costs of one of Foodlink's vans, which collects surplus food from various donors, such as hotels and restaurants, and has been extending its distribution network to cover more areas in Hong Kong. To ensure freshness, all collected food is stored in special containers and then transferred to refrigerated vans for delivery to NGOs, which further distribute to those in need.

CPF has committed to sponsoring 100 Child Development Fund scholarships to three SKH secondary schools.

Students who save HK\$4,800 over 2 years will get a matching fund of the same amount from the scholarship. Together with the HK\$3,000 from the Government, students can use the HK\$12,600 in funds for career-related training programmes or for buying musical instruments, computers, etc., in the third year.

Project BLESS aims to support people who have lost loved ones to suicide by guiding them through the journey of bereavement. The prevention programme includes individual, family and group counselling, as well as therapeutic activities and promotional materials. Our goal is to empower survivors to regain the will to live and to raise public awareness about the needs of those affected by suicide and to connect them with support systems in their communities.

The Danny D.B. Ho Lecture & Workshop Series in Holistic Therapy

Partner:	Centre on Behavioral Health, University of Hong Kong

Beneficiaries:	Healthcare Practitioners & General Public



CPF is honoured to support the Centre on Behavioral Health at the University of Hong Kong, which arranged a thought-provoking series of lectures and workshops on holistic therapy in 2012 and 2013. In total, the centre organized 12 public lectures, 20 professional training courses and two symposiums, which attracted over 2500 people in the last two years. Local and internationally renowned experts were invited to share their knowledge and experience in holistic therapy and alternative approaches to healing.

The aim of the lecture series - which was named in memory of Mr Danny D.B.Ho, who passed away in 2011 - is to raise awareness and promote a better understanding of holistic therapy among health professionals and the general public, especially its emphasis on mind-body balance, which nicely complements conventional approaches to medicine.

The 2013 Symposium, named "No Beginning and No End: Well-Being in the Present Moment," was held on 14 November, 2013 at the Grand Hall at the University of Hong Kong. The keynote speakers, Carol Cox and Dr Yasuyuki Nemoto, led talks on the theoretical concept of the Holistic Round of Formation and the amazing effect of love and gratitude of the shape of water crystals.





The Centre on Behavioral Health has done an outstanding job educating the public about the benefits of holistic therapy. Based on feedback from speakers and participants, the general public and professionals alike greatly benefited from the lecture and workshops, taking with them life-long skills they can use in their daily lives and to help others in their community.

“Family at Ease” Mental Health Programme on Youth

Partner: Breakthrough
Commencement Date: 1 October, 2013
Duration: 1 year
Beneficiaries: Youth & their Families



This project helps youth and their families who are suffering from stress through Christian faith-based psychological counselling and by promoting mental and emotional health public seminars.

Two parenting talks “情緒警戒線講座” were organized on 28 March and 11 April, 2014 at the Breakthrough Jordan Centre. Over 200



participants, including parents, school teachers, social workers and also social work students, attended the talks. The speakers, Ringo & Lea, experienced Breakthrough counsellors, described the symptoms of depression & anxiety in youth, and the importance of empathy and communication between parents and their children. They also used real-life examples to demonstrate prevention methods that parents could use to help their children. This includes adopting a more positive attitude, which helps to manage stress and anxiety and builds up the child's life challenges.

A co-production with Chinese University of Hong Kong's Psychological Department and RTHK, CPF sponsored the production of a 5-episode TV Series called “Falling Down, Standing Up” (壓力不倒翁), which aired on TVB Jade, RTHK TV 31 and i-Cable Live News Channel in June & July 2013. The show aims to raise public concern about the importance of mental health and stress management by encouraging people to be more proactive about addressing the problem and to learn more about how to help those in need.



Thanks to wide public support, the programme reached #8 in the TV Programme Appreciation Index Survey Award 2013. The English subtitle version will air from 8 October to 5 November, 2014 (Wednesday) on ATV World.

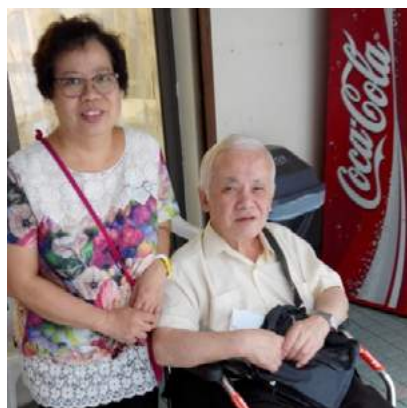

Senior members of St. Stephen's Church, St. Luke's Church and St. Timothy's Church can seek assistance from the part-time Social Worker at St. Stephen's Church for issues such as physical and mental health, housing, finance, government-funded social service applications, etc. The church also arranges home visits to congregants in need, as well as subsequent referral and assistance. CPF is very grateful to have the chance to serve the community through the funding of this project, through which we are able to reach out and help those in need.

Social Worker at St. Paul's Co-educational College

Partner: St. Paul's Co-educational College (SPCC)
Commencement Date: Since March, 2013
Beneficiaries: SPCC's Students and Teachers



Since March 2013, CPF has supported the hiring of a second full-time social worker at SPCC, whose main focus has been providing preventive programmes to nurture the mental wellbeing of students. These extra resources have helped to relieve the overwhelming workload of the existing social worker.



Past programmes include: developmental workshops, such as Play Sharing Practice (PSP), which helps at-risk students by fostering their interpersonal and communication skills through various games and outdoor activities, and Play Sharing Practice II (PSP II), which helps students further develop their cooperation skills and is aimed at boosting their self-esteem; the Life Connection Mentorship (LCM) programme, which helps students who need emotional support by exposing them to life outside of school, which connects them to the wider community and teaches them skills to improve their self-efficiency and confidence; Big Brother Big Sister (B.B.B.S), which provides mentorship to Form 1 students through orientation days, fun outings like baseball games, Easter celebrations and picnics after exams; Over 300 students were served in 2013-14.



Support of CDMF Carol Singing Festival

Partner: Child Development Matching Fund (CDMF)
Commencement Date: December, 2013
Beneficiaries: Mentees of CDMF



The Child Development Matching Fund (CDMF) runs a financial planning programme that helps youth develop a habit of saving money and teaches them financial literacy, so they know how to manage their personal savings. With the help of their family, participants in the programme are encouraged to save HK\$200 a month over the span of two years. Once that target is reached, the youth will receive a matching fund of HK\$4,800 from CDMF.



To raise these matching funds, CDMF organizes the Christmas Carol Singing Festival each year, which requires each participating singer to donate HK\$200. In 2013, CPF sponsored a total of 3 choirs singing at IFC, including Hong Kong University Alumni Association, SKH St. Mary's Church Mok Hing Yiu College and SKH Li Ping Secondary College, for a total of 130 choir team members.

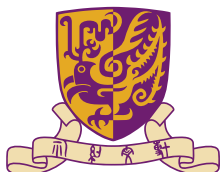
