Our Founder

Beatrice Y.M. Mok

Founder of the Community Partner Foundation

Ms. Beatrice Mok is a Harvard University MBA who runs a successful property management and investment company in Hong Kong. With the help of her daughters, Sylvia, Lydia and Tania, she founded the Community Partner Foundation in 2012 in memory of her late husband, Mr. Danny D B Ho who passed away in March 2011.

Her vision was to create a legacy in memory of her late husband which would foster a society that embodies total health, in body, mind and spirit. Through the foundation, Ms. Mok compassionately supports initiatives which extend care to, and lift the spirits of those facing life's difficult challenges.

Our Mission

The Foundation's primary mission is to educate people on how to deal with life's challenges so that they are more resilient during difficult times such as the loss of a friend, a loved one, or even loss of employment.



Projects with Hong Kong University

The Danny D B Ho Professorship in Family Medicine

In 2012, \$10 million was donated to Hong Kong University to establish the Danny D B Ho Professorship in Family Medicine. The late Danny Ho recognised the pivotal role of family medicine as the first level of care in the healthcare process and it was his wish to leave a legacy that would facilitate innovative research and development in family medicine and primary care.



The Endowed Professorship provides financial assistance to Professor Cindy L K Lam who is leading the new Department of Family Medicine and Primary Care at the University of Hong Kong. With Professor Lam's guidance, the funds are put to good use in nurturing new academics in their research into family medicine and primary care. The new department is also planning to form a consortium with other departments of primary care in the United Kingdom and Hong Kong to develop primary care in Mainland China.

Danny D B Ho Lecture and Workshop Series in Holistic Therapy

The Danny D B Ho Lecture and Workshop Series in Holistic Therapy was launched in collaboration with the Centre on Behavioral Health at the University of Hong Kong. At the Centre on Behavioral Health, Prof. Cecilia Chan and Dr Rainbow Ho aim to promote holistic health in the community and \$1.8 million was donated to fund a two year series of Lectures and Workshops to educate both healthcare practitioners and the general public about the value of using holistic therapy to complement conventional medicine.

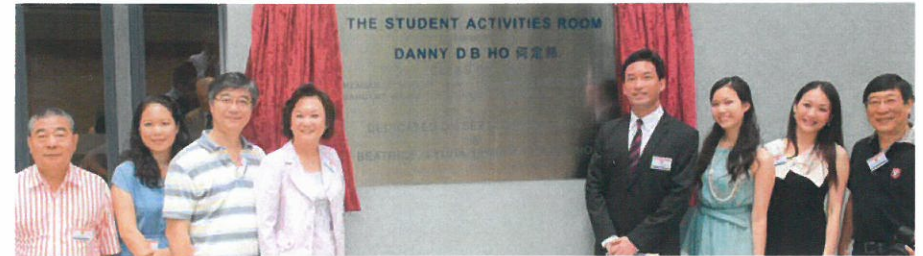
The 10 workshops and 2 symposiums are being delivered over 2 years (2012-13) by leading international experts. There are 3 major themes: integrative body-mind spirit approach, expressive arts therapy and energy therapy.



Youth Projects

Student Activities Room

The Foundation also contributed \$3.8 million to Danny's former high school, Diocesan Boys' School, towards the construction of a Student Activities Room.



Mr. Danny Ho was in DBS Table Tennis Team for a number of years and was Sargent House Table Tennis Team Captain 1962 through 1964. To memorialise Danny's love for the sport and his high school alma mater, the activities room was established to encourage students to take up extra circular activities.



Breakthrough Youth Foundation

Founded by Dr. Philemon Choi, the Breakthrough Youth Foundation helps the younger generation unveil their potential through exposure to a variety of media and personal contacts guiding them to know themselves, put their ideals into reality, encourage one another and care for the community. The foundation supports its initiatives by providing donations towards local and mainland youth projects.

Church Projects

Refurbishment of Dining Hall, St. Johns College at University of Hong Kong

A former residential hall St Johnian, Danny D B Ho was very involved in student activities, particularly choir singing and table tennis. He was an enthusiastic participant of various college activities and inter-hall events. In honour of Danny, \$1 million was donated towards the refurbishment of the Danny Ho Bradbury Hall which was modeled on the historic dining hall of Cambridge University and the vision of Rev Dr. Eric Chong and Dr. K C Wong.

St James' Church Choir Room

\$800,000 was donated to St. James' Church under Revd Lysta Leung for a new choir room in the new St. James' Church building which is due for completion in the midst of 2013.

Sheng Kung Hui Ming Hua Theological College Lectureship

To promote the Gospel of Christ, the Foundation will sponsor a series of visiting professorships arranged by Dr Gareth Jones, Principal of SKH Ming Hua Theological College, in the name of Mrs. Rita Mok, the mother of the founder. The lectureship invites distinguished international scholars in all the major fields of theological studies, such as biblical studies, church history, doctrines, relationship of church and society, Christian faith and human personality development. The lectures will be primarily offered to the students of Ming Hua Theological College but there will also be public lectures which will be subsequently published and made available online.

Sheng Kung Hui Hymn Book

As Mr. Danny B Ho was a former choir member at St John's Cathedral, the Foundation is providing the financial support necessary for compiling, obtaining copyrights and printing a new updated hymn book for Sheng Kung Hui (Anglican) churches, schools and organisations in Hong Kong and Macau under the leadership of the Standing Commission of Liturgical Matters. This is a 5 year project expected to be completed in 2017.

Mental Wellbeing Projects

Mental Health Education: Clinical and Health Psychology Centre - Chinese University of HK

In collaboration with the Clinical and Health Psychology Centre at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, the Foundation will be providing funding to promote public education in mental health in 2013-14 through mass media under Prof. Fanny Cheung and Prof. Patrick Leung.

Dance with Depression Association

Dance with Depression Association is a charitable organisation founded by Dr Therese Chan Wan Tung in 2002, to help people who struggle from depression by organising free emotional support groups and psycho-education groups for them.
