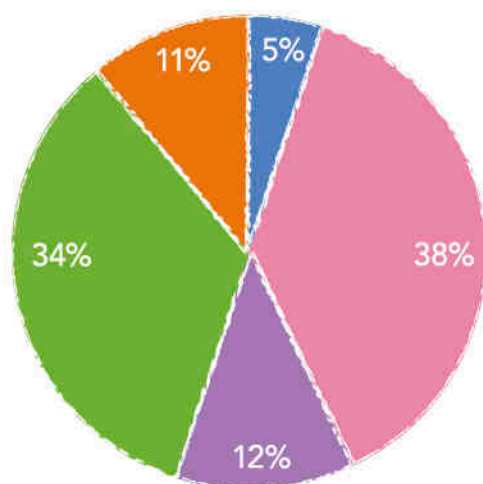

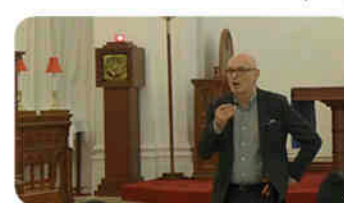

New Project Highlights

From the Founder Outreach to Missionaries in Chiang Rai



While I was visiting Chiang Rai in January 2015, I learnt that Rev Danny Lai from Wycliffe, Sydney, Australia had just given a sermon in Chiang Rai. As I wish to learn more about missionaries in Chiang Rai, he introduced me to Mr Hung Tung Chan 陳鴻通先生, a retired policeman from Hong Kong, focusing on student work in the two Royal universities. Similar to all missionaries, he has to learn the Thai language first, usually in Bangkok before he could start his work. We are most impressed.



In March 2015, together with Mr Fred Kan, Mr Danny Lee, and Mr Edwin Mok from Country Network from Sydney, we joined the Sunday service at American Baptist Baan Athitaan Church run by Pastor Michael Johnson from USA who started in 2001 by setting up the Grace English Language School to reach the Thai people. Mr Chan also introduced us to Ms Grace Kwok, from Hong Kong Association of Baptists for World Evangelism (HKABWE) who has started work in Northern Thailand since 1999, and Rev Yeung 楊從光牧師 of Baptist Church at Maesaelong: home to the 93rd division Kuomintang who fled Yunnan after defeat in the Chinese Civil War in the 1950s. Rev Yeung came to Northern Thailand from Myanmar and has just finished building a beautiful new Baptist Church and a school for Thai Children who come to study Chinese and English after school from 4 pm to 6 pm daily. We also visited Grace Seminary School 天恩神學院, founded by

Rev Lee from Vancouver, Canada, headed by Ms Dara Mak 麥香蘭女士 from Hong Kong who has been in missionary work in Thailand for over 27 years.

As from that time, with the Grace of God, we are introduced to many missionaries, churches and Christian children centres. In June and November 2015, we visited most of them and presented them the Cross from St Stephen's Church, gifts for the children and bags of rice from our farm together with Rev Paul Ip of St Stephen's Church, The Very Rev Samson Fan of All Saints' Cathedral, Rev Jonathan Chee of The Church of Shalom, Rev Tsui Yuk Fan of St Mary's Church, Dr Jane Lee, Director of Sheng Kung Hui Welfare Council (SKHWC), Ms Seiko Lee and Ms Cannis Chan, Service Directors of SKHWC, Mr Cooke Cheung, Assistant Chief Executive Officer of St James' Settlement, and retired school principals from SKH St Mary's Church Mok Hing Yiu College. In April and August 2016, the Joyful Age Group led by Rev Paul Ip and the Youth Group led by Rev Arthur Ho respectively, both from St Stephen's Church, visited several villages for missionary work. The highlights and thoughts from these trips are posted throughout this booklet.



New Project Highlights

Social Enterprises, Student Explorations in Chiang Rai



In addition to church visits, we have also visited social enterprises, student explorations and service projects. Instead of opium, the Thai government has encouraged the planting of tea and coffee in the Golden Triangle. We have visited the following places:

- Hall of Opium, a first class museum on drug history
- Coffee plantation run by hill tribes, and Doi Chaang Coffee, one of the top ten social enterprises
- Tea tasting and plantations run by descendants of Kuomintang
- The Thai-Myanmar Border
- The Thai-Laos Border



"It would be a unique opportunity for the adolescents from Hong Kong to serve the underprivileged group and needy in Chiang Rai. Due to the fast-paced living style in Hong Kong, the adolescents sometimes lost the focus and meaning of life, Chiang Rai is a fascinated place to slow down the daily pacing and good for feeling our bodies and mind. For instance, it would be so challenging but rewarding experience for the Hong Kong adolescents as the volunteers in Mae Kok Foundation, they would prepare lessons to the children, develop the infrastructure, renovate building, etc, in the foundation. When serving the ethnic minorities and disadvantaged group, it would broaden the living horizon of Hong Kong adolescents and experience how life is beautiful."

In spring 2016, CPF sponsored the audio system headphones for members of the SKH St Stephen's Church who need hearing aids during worship services or fellowship gatherings within the church premises.

In collaboration with the Rachel Club of St James' Settlement, the SKH St James' Church Sunday School let nursery and kindergarten children learn about Biblical stories through creative activities. Through singing, games, role playing, art and crafts, and experiment, children learn how to appreciate the wonders created by the Almighty God. The hands-on activities also help the children to develop positive personalities and good motor skills.

CPF took the opportunity to serve the Church by funding the programme.

\$10 Meals

Partner: Heep Yunn School, St Stephen's Church College, and Espuma
Period: 30 June 2016 & 7 July 2016
Beneficiaries: Students of Heep Yunn School and St Stephen's Church College



CPF invited Mr Eric Liang and volunteers from Espuma to organise \$10 meal classes for 20 students from Heep Yunn School on 30 June 2016 and for 20 students from St Stephen's Church College on 7 July 2016. Using recipes from \$10 meal cook books published by Feeding Hong Kong, Mr Liang demonstrated and cooked with the students a total of four dishes, two on each occasion. The students then took home their own dishes to share with their families.



"The \$10 meals programme organized by CPF with Heep Yunn School and St. Stephen's Church College provided an excellent opportunity to the children with the right education on food. We brought to them food to grow up on, food for friends and family to share, classis with a twist and healthy food. The SKH Holy Cross Primary School Fundraising

After serving the community for 50 years, the SKH Ching Shan Primary School and the SKH Yat Sau Primary School merged to become the SKH Holy Cross Primary School in 2015.

The new mega-school site for the SKH Holy Cross Primary School was completed in time to house the first graduation ceremony of the School on 18th June 2016.

The new school premises features non-government-subsidised items, including an ecofriendly air conditioning system, a classroom multimedia system, a school hall public address system, lighting and stage equipment, and other basic furniture and fixtures. This is made possible by donations from friends, alumni and partners of the school.

In recognition of CPF's patronage, the School Hall was named the Mok Wong Fung Yee Hall, in memory of CPF's founding member the late Mrs Rita Mok.



Private Screenings of My Voice, My Life

Partner: SKH Schools, Churches, and NGOs
 Period: 15 & 22 November 2014
 Beneficiaries: Educationists, counsellors, youth mentors, and students



CPF organised two private screenings of My Voice, My Life in November 2014. The documentary movie showed the poignant stories of a group of under-privileged Hong Kong youngsters who underwent six months of vigorous trainings to produce a musical on stage. The training programme, organised by the L plus H Creations Foundation, transformed the youngsters by teaching them artistic skills and by nurturing positive characters in them such as punctuality and self-confidence. Hoping that the story could inspire its viewers, CPF invited educationists, counsellors, youth mentors and students to watch the documentary. A total of 233 guests attended the two screenings.

SKH St Mary's Church Mok Hing Yiu College bid farewell to the then-principal Ms Kelly Cheng in 2015. With the support of CPF, Mrs Rita Mok and Mr Edwin Mok, the Kelly Cheng Scholarship was set up to commend Ms Cheng's long service and tremendous contributions to the College. On Speech Day 2016, two students received the Outstanding Community Services Award which was sponsored by CPF.



Digitalisation of Cave Murals & Statues in Mogao Grottoes in Dunhuang

Partner: Friends of Dunhuang (Hong Kong)
 Period: June 2011, November 2014
 Beneficiaries: General Public



The murals and statues in the Mogao Grottoes in Dunhuang have been under the threat of deterioration due to natural and man-made factors. To preserve this cultural World Heritage Site, the Friends of Dunhuang (Hong Kong) raises funds for the Dunhuang Research Academy to digitalise the cave murals and statues before they are forever lost.

The founder of CPF Ms Beatrice Mok and her daughters joined the conservation efforts in June 2011 by sponsoring the digitalisation project of statues in Cave 45 & 159 and murals in Cave 390. On 28 November 2014 in the ceremony concluding the project, Ms Elsie Leung, GBM, JP, together with Ms Fan Jinshi, Director of the Dunhuang Research Academy, presented Certificates of Appreciation and portrays of murals and statues to the donors.

In response to further appeal for funding preserving many more other artefacts in the Mogao Grottoes, CPF sponsored the expenses for digitalisation of the murals in Cave 321 in November 2014 and received a certificate and a gift box from Mr Gabirle Yu, Chairman of the Friends of Dunhuang (Hong Kong), in the completion celebration on 12 December 2015.

To help leaders of local nonprofit organisations with limited resources cope with broadening demands for services and changing operating environments, the Harvard Business School Association of Hong Kong offers such individuals scholarships to attend the annual week-long “Strategic Perspectives in Nonprofit Management” summer residential programme at Harvard Business School in Boston, USA.

CPF sponsored two scholarships to awardees from Feeding Hong Kong and SKH St John's Cathedral in 2015 and another awardee from Asian Charity Services in 2016.

“今年四月聖公會聖士提反堂樂齡團契一群長者在社聯伙伴基金的贊助下，前往泰北清萊探訪當地基督教教會和宣教的工作。泰北清萊接近中、緬及寮國的邊境，乃是昔日聞名於世的「金三角」地區，但環境卻比想像中的寧靜安穩。昔日種植的鴉片的地方已不復見，今天只見遍地種滿各式各樣的花卉，令人心身歡愉。在社聯伙伴的悉心安排下，我們一行二十多人探訪了當地不同的基督教教會和學童寄宿中心，也包括一些少數民族的教會，並瞭解他們的工作和需要，擴闊了我們的眼界和思想。當中我們認識了一位從香港而來的姊妹，她與阿卡族的傳道人結婚，並一起建立了「清萊永生佈道所」，收養當地流離失所的孩童和牧養阿卡族人，他們在資源有限的情況下仍然努力服侍，幫助族人栽種咖啡改善生活。他們無私的奉獻，實在令人感動不已。

在旅程中我們也探訪清萊多間基督教教會，包括清萊恩典浸信會、清萊基督教主恩堂和清萊恩福教會等，尤以主恩堂的建築外型仿照舊約聖經挪亞方舟，非常特別和吸引，且能為福音作見證，而清萊恩福教會亦是一所學生寄宿學校，提供學生課餘的學習活動和肩負宣教的工作，頗具規模。我們還參加了教會的主日崇拜，惟因行程匆忙，彼此只能作短暫的交流。今次旅程令我們獲益良多，非常寶貴，也看見清萊教會在跨文化和種族的宣教成果，激發了我們對當地福音工作的關心和代禱。”

St Stephen's Church Youth Fellowship Group Evangelical Missionary Trip to Chiang Rai 2016



“6天的行程，我們走訪了8個群體及教會，接觸了800多位泰國朋友，我們有4位弟兄姊妹見證分享，上演了3齣戲劇，辦了2個嘉年華會，刷了1面外牆。行程緊密，希望用盡每分每秒，將歡樂、知識、技能並基督的愛帶給他們，但想不到我們得著的比付出更多。

清萊山區資源匱乏，居民生活簡樸卻流露著知足的心境，足見使徒保羅的教導落實於每天生活中，這對我們是好好的學習。孩童不需要電玩、主題公園，簡單的遊戲已樂透半天，團友還學會了在香港失傳多時的「抓子」。天父也待我們不薄，明明天氣預測是大雷雨，結果每每是上車下雨，下車陰天，連我們最擔心的戶外掃漆，也能及時畫完，完成後天父還幽默地讓夕陽照耀著信心不足的我們。

這趟不是香港人喜歡的旅遊，透過服侍、與語言不通的孩子接觸，更讓我們讚嘆天父能在不同的族群中作工，這是一趟與主相遇的旅程。

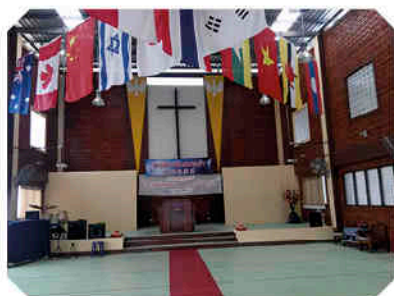
Chiang Khong Christian Education Center (CCEC)

基督教昌孔教育中心



CCEC is run by Rev Ma Siu Wan 馬小芸牧師 who has been in Thailand for more than 45 years with her late husband Rev Ho 何以嵩牧師. They established (1) a children centre 基督教頌讚宿舍 in 1994 (currently 38 children), (2) a church 基督教永通浸信會 in 1995, (3) a kindergarten 基督教晨光幼稚園 in 1998, (4) a primary school 基督教晨光學校小學 in 2004, (5) another children centre 恩慈之家 in 2006 (currently 6 children), (6) a junior high school in 2009. There are 470 students in total in the kindergarten, the primary school and the junior high school. All teachers are Christians.

Rev Ma wishes to build a senior high school and CPF has assisted to produce the master layout plan with local architects in March 2016. The building of the senior high school will start in November 2016 for completion in 2018.

New Project Highlights

Maesalong and Maesai Churches



“雖然泰國政府向國民提供免費的中小學教育，但不包括住宿，對於生活在山區的家庭來說，送孩子上學仍是一件困難的事。楊世忠牧師負責，位於Maesai的教會群體——迦南僕僕福音協會Canaan Lisu Gospel Fellowship，看到山區孩子的需要，接待了九十多位大部份來自山區的青少年，提供免費住宿和教授中文，一方面讓孩子有接受教育的機會，學習中文能增加孩子未來的就業機會；同時，讓孩子們可以有機會認識耶穌基督的福音。

在Maesalong(美斯樂)地區一聚居了一大群上世紀五十年代初從中國大陸撤退過來的國民政府軍人和家眷，在當地落地生根，成為一個獨特的華語社區。由於泰國政府規定，學校只可以泰文授課，由楊從光牧師主理的美斯樂基督教浸信會禮拜堂(Maesalong Baptist Church)，於正規學校下午四時放學後，教會為學童提供中文學習和聖經課，讓華人文化得以傳承，亦讓孩子們可以學習聖經真理。

"Family at Ease" Mental Health Programme

Partner: Breakthrough
Period: October 2013 – September 2017
Beneficiaries: Young people and their families



"Family at Ease" uses the family unit as the foundation to promote mental health in young people. The project consists of two areas: the counselling aspect combines professional counselling with Christian faith to tackle emotional problems and build positive characters in young people; the education aspect strengthens the understanding and bonding between young people and their parents so that the family can act as a safe haven during times of adversity.

Now in its third year, with the backing of CPF, Breakthrough has incorporated new elements to parenting education in this project. Besides increasing the number of existing parenting talks and workshops, Breakthrough has published a book and a series of videos (8 episodes) to teach parents through case studies the techniques to communicate with their children better. The new book & DVD set was launched at the Hong Kong Book Fair in July 2016 and a talk was held on 23 July to share with parents the insights from the book. The first kickoff parenting talk in 2016 was held on 14 October. 40 talks will follow in 2017.

Project BLESS

Partner: Suicide Prevention Services
Period: September 2013 – August 2016
Beneficiaries: Those affected by suicide loss



Project BLESS helps survivors of suicide loss to cope with loss of their loved ones. The project consists of a two-pronged approach – to assist survivors on their bereavement journey and to arouse public awareness on the needs of survivors. Active postvention programmes, such as counselling, therapeutic activities, and mutual support groups, are carried out to empower survivors with the will to live on.

Suicide Prevention Services publishes brochures, posters, educational videos, and resource & healing booklets to promote its service to survivors and to inform the public of the difficulties faced by survivors. Three educational videos were aired on Roadshow in August 2015 and subsequently uploaded to the Project BLESS website. The resource & healing booklet was separated into two individual ones – the resource booklet focusing on tangible resources available to survivors and the healing booklet supporting them emotionally – and was reprinted in 2016 to include the newest information.

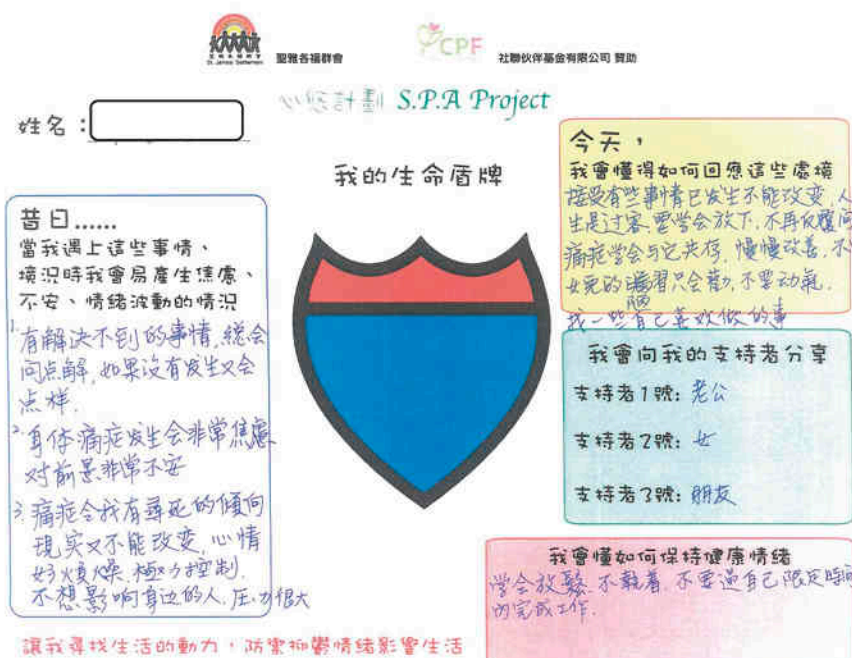

Partner: St James' Settlement

Run by the St James' Settlement, the S.P.A. Project started in 2014 as a depression-relapse prevention programme for women in Tin Shui Wai who had completed the Integrated Mental Health Programme (IMHP) under the Hospital Authority. The project has since then expanded to include cases referred by social workers in schools and by other NGOs.



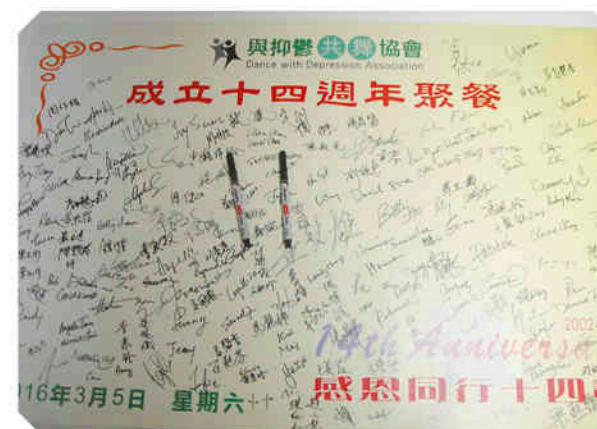
Dance with Depression Member Therapy Sponsorship Programme

Partner: Dance with Depression Association
 Period: November 2013 – February 2018
 Beneficiaries: Patients suffering from chronic depression



Dance with Depression Association (DWD) is a charitable organisation established and run by a group of volunteer counsellors, social workers, psychiatrists, and doctors. The association is currently headed by Dr Therese Chan 陳允彤 醫生. DWD organises support groups to help patients suffering from chronic depression.

A significant portion of the members of DWD come from low-income families and do not have the means to undergo individual counselling and psychotherapy. The financial support from CPF under the Member Therapy Sponsorship Programme provides such members with one-to-one counselling.



"The project is highly appreciated by the members as well as their counsellors/ psychotherapists with positive feedbacks received. The majority expressed that their self-awareness was enhanced so that the self-esteem and interpersonal relationships were improved. Through individual counselling, they learned new coping strategies and therefore reduced maladaptive and high risk behavior."

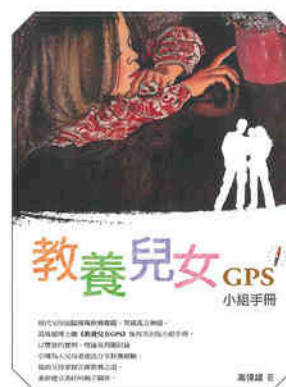
Mrs Mok Hing Yiu Lecture

Partner: Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui
 Period: March 2014, June & July 2015, September & October 2016
 Beneficiaries: Clergies, Congregation, Educators, Students, Social Workers, and the General Public



The Mrs Mok Hing Yiu Lecture is an annual series of lectures sponsored by CPF under Mrs Rita Mok's name and organised by the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui subsidiaries. The lecture series explores contemporary issues from the Christian theological perspective.

The Religious Education Resource Center (RERC) organised the lectures in June & July 2015. Dr Timothy Ko 高偉雄博士 from the USA discussed how to resolve conflicts in "Spiritual Refreshment."



In September & October 2016, Father Anselm Grün from Germany delivered his words of wisdom on replacing negative thoughts with positive possibilities, a spiritual understanding of dreams, spiritual care of medical professionals, and spirituality of counsellors. A total of 17 lectures were organised by RERC.

CPF-CDF Scholarships for HKSKH Secondary Schools

Period: 2014 – 2017

Beneficiaries: Students of HKSKH secondary schools



In 2014, CPF undertook to sponsor a total of 100 students who participate in the Child Development Fund (CDF) programme. They are students from SKH All Saints' Middle School, SKH St Simon's Lui Ming Choi Secondary School, and SKH Bishop Baker Secondary School.

CDF is a government organised programme for the under-privileged students aged from 10 to 16. This is a three year-programme for (i) Target Savings (ii) Mentorship (iii) Personal Development Plan (PDP). To assist the students to form a habit of saving, each of them has to save HK\$200 per month for 24 months making a total of HK\$4,800. Once this target saving is reached by the 24th month, each participant will receive a matching sum of HK\$4,800 from CPF and in addition, the government will top up HK\$3,000 making a total of HK\$12,600 available to the student, who then can make use of this HK\$12,600 to fulfil his dream, further study, or develop his career, etc.

SKH All Saints' Middle School started the CDF programme in January 2014 and 49 students completed the first two years in 2016. Whereas the other two SKH schools started in May 2014 and 47 students completed the first two years in 2016.

CDMF is set up to raise funding from the commercial organisations to match savings from families who join the Child Development Fund (CDF) programme organised by the Hong Kong Government.

In 2014, CPF sponsored a total of 4 choirs singing in International Finance Centre (IFC) Concourse. They were Hong Kong University Alumni Association, SKH St Mary's Church Mok Hing Yiu College, SKH All Saints' Middle School, and Joyful Age Group Choir of HKSKH St Stephen's Church. For each participant singing in the festival, CPF sponsored HK\$200 to CDMF.



In 2015, CPF sponsored 3 choirs singing in K11 and IFC. They were SKH St Mary's Church Mok Hing Yiu College, Joyful Age Group Choir of HKSKH St Stephen's Church, and Hong Kong University Alumni Association.

In view of the project's success, CPF has further extended its support of this programme. By walking alongside students and providing help when necessary, CPF hopes to ensure the mental wellness of the students at SPCC at a crucial time of their psychosocial development.
